2014 Horse Validation on 4-H Connect – Open March 1st – May 1st

2014 Horse Show Rules and Regulations - New and Important changes are in RED text

2014 State 4-H Horse Show Schedule – REVIEW CAREFULLY – Major changes from past years

2014 State 4-H Horse Show Entries on 4-H Connect – Open June 1st – July 1st

Three (3) new classes ADDED – Hunt Seat Versatility, Stock Horse Horsemanship, and Cow Boxing

HORSE VALIDATION PERIOD IS:

March 1, 2014 to April 15, 2014 \$10.00 per horse

April 16, 2014 to May 1, 2014 \$20.00 per horse

Validation and payment is required of ALL horses regardless if they were entered this year or last!

FOR THOSE ENTERING A NEW HORSE INTO 4-H CONNECT, BEFORE YOU BEGIN YOUR VALIDATION PROCESS, YOU MUST:

Have a family and youth member profile established on 4-H CONNECT

Be an active/paid youth member of Texas 4-H for the 2013-2014 year.

For any horse which was NOT validated in 4-H CONNECT last year, have digital photos of your horse(s) from the front, left side, and right side. These photos must be accessible for upload during the validation process.

For any registered horse that was NOT validated last year you will need to have a pdf copy of your horse(s) registration papers for upload.

LCFA FCS Division Reminders

It's time to start thinking about your Family & Consumer Sciences division entries for the county show. Things to remember:

- This year we are sticking to rule #18—food entries may only be on a disposable board or paper plate and covered in clear plastic wrap. This year we will NOT be accepting any entries in decorated baskets, covered cake sets, or similar. Entries will only be accepted if brought in on disposable goods. Please ask BEFORE check-in if you are not sure!
- For food items (class 1-15), a copy of the recipe must be turned in with the entry form.
- Another copy of the recipe (without your name) must also be attached to the food item upon check-in.
- Entry fees—Class 1-15 is \$3.00 per item; Class 16-33 is \$1.00 per item.
- If you have not validated any animal projects, then the yearly family membership fee of \$10.00 (or lifetime \$100.00 membership) must be paid to the Limestone County Fair & Youth Livestock Show.

In addition to all the food classes, there are also classes that encompass paintings, photographs, drawings, needlework, woodwork, home décor, potted plants, and more. Check out the 2014 rulebook for more information.
