








BATTLEGROUND TO BE EAKING GROUND

Tuition Waived Option


Through various USDA funded grants, the BGBG program is able to provide 15 tuition waived spots per cohort for veterans, active military, and a select number of other beginning farmers and ranchers. Applications for a tuition waiver are now open on a rolling basis.

- · 15 spots per cohort
- · Application Required
- Competitive process: Online application and 3 letters of support required
- In-person attendance to Basic Training & Graduation required; \$125 registration fee
- · 100 hours of hands-on training required
- Only waives tuition for Phase 2; tuition waiver for Phase 3 based on performance in Phase 2

Tuition Paid Option

- · 30 spots per cohort available
- Tuition is required; Phase 2 \$600 & Phase 3 \$900
- Available for veterans, active-duty military, and all other farmers/ranchers
- No application process
- In-person attendance at Basic Training & Graduation is optional

8 hrs of Pesticide CEU's Offered

A multi-county Farm and Ranch Seminar for farmers and ranchers conducted by the Texas A&M AgriLife
Extension Service in District 8 is scheduled December
14, 2023. The District 8 Farm and Ranch Seminar will be offered at numerous locations across Central Texas.

Private Applicators License holders must obtain 15 hours of CEUs every five years to renew/recertify their license; including two hours of Laws and Regulations, two hours of Integrated Pest Management (IPM), and any mix of these and General hours to equal the required 15 hours of CEUs. Licensed commercial and non-commercial applicators are required to recertify every year by obtaining five continuing education credits with one credit each from two of the following categories: laws and regulations, integrated pest management or drift minimization.

The December 14th seminar will provide participants with the opportunity to receive up to eight (8) CEUs. Of the eight (8) hours, four (4) hours will be in General, two (2) hours in IPM, and two (2) hours in Laws and Regulations.

Licensed commercial and non-commercial applicators will be able to obtain their required five hours within the first five hours of the program. Program registration cost is \$60.00,


